Dear Parents and Carers

"Good morning, good morning!" sang Scarlett, Tobi and Ted yesterday, as they launched our Year 6 Open Evening with an extract from our production Singin' in the Rain. They were followed by our superb hosts for the evening, Head Girl Jeannie and Head Boy Luke, who welcomed to the school pupils in Year 6, their parents, carers and families. It was a beautiful sunny autumn evening, and the school and its grounds looked magnificent, as they frequently do. Jeannie and Luke spoke confidently and with expertise about the subjects they are studying, their aspirations for the future, and how their experiences at school have helped them to become who they are. They introduced first me and, later, Mrs Jacobson, whose meticulous organisation had made the event such a success, and whose pastoral care ensures our transition process works so well for students and families.

Over 620 people attended the evening, which ended for staff at 8:30pm. I want to begin by thanking all our own students, who volunteered within subjects and acted as tour guides. Over 300 students gave their time, including many students in Year 7 – who have been members of Lord Lawson for only just over three weeks! Very many of our visitors commented on how impressed they were with our students, who confidently showed them around their school, demonstrated the different subjects, and spoke with year 6 pupils. Our visitors spoke about how genuinely lovely our students are, how enthusiastic they are, and how well they get on with one another and with the adults in the school. If your child was involved, thank you so much for supporting them to be part of this special event. I shall be giving the Principal's Award (P5) and a certificate to every student.

A reminder to those of you who have children in Year 6 and who want a place at Lord Lawson next year: you need to complete the online application through Gateshead (or your own local authority if you live in a different area). The deadline for applications is 31 October, but I urge you to complete your application well before then, after you have visited the schools in which you are interested. In response to increased demand, we are making an additional 30 places available at Lord Lawson next year.

I also want to thank my colleagues, our staff, for their work at our Open Evening. The majority of our teaching and non-teaching staff were present all evening, and their contribution to this important event was critical.

Performing Arts: Music Updates

Instrumental Music Lessons Autumn 2025

Thank you to everyone who returned their forms regarding Music Lessons for this term and made their payments via Parent Pay. All timetables have now been created and are displayed on the Music noticeboard in the Performing Arts Department, outside PA10 and the Dance Studio. Students should check the timetable on the day of their lesson and make a note of their lesson time.

As a guide for students, instrumental provision takes place for:

Piano/Keyboard – on Monday or Thursday Drum Kit – on Tuesday Guitar lessons – on Wednesday Woodwind and Brass – on Thursday String – on Friday

Any students bringing their own instrument into the Academy should safely store it in Rehearsal Room 1 before tutor time. See a member of the Performing Arts team in the department to ensure the instrument is securely stored and locked in the room. Please note that as with all personal possessions, these are brought into the academy at your own risk and are not covered by our insurance.

Music Homework Years 7-9

Focus on Sound Music homework is set every fortnight and is completed on the Focus on Sound platform. The platform is designed to promote independent learning through text, video and audio clips and culminate in a structured quiz that tests students recall of prior learning and will also consolidate skills taught in class. Student logins and passwords have been setup so that they are the same login as their email address and password details that they use to login to computers in school. If you wish to explore the platform further, you can also access Focus on Sound through the hyperlink: https://portal.focusonsound.com/, or use the help guide found later in this bulletin.

All homework links to Focus on Sound are set in Class Charts so students can easily access their homework. Students are asked to log in to the program and complete the work before their next Music lesson. All students who meet the deadline and achieve a score of 30% or above are allocated a P1 praise point. Students who achieve 75% or more are rewarded with a P2. If, at the end of a half term, a student has worked outstandingly to a 100% grade in every piece of work they have submitted, they will receive a P3 for their consistent, positive effort and attitude. It is wonderful to give out so many rewards to recognise the dedication and commitment our students have towards their home learning and supporting their work in class.

If your child has any problems accessing their homework, please encourage them to speak to their music teacher or email them prior to their next lesson, so that any issues can be avoided, and the teacher can help them as soon as possible. 

Year 11 into 12 Taster Day

On Monday 6 October, all year 11 students will be off timetable to experience a post-16 careers day. During year 10, these students were interviewed by our careers advisors, Mrs Braban and Mrs Leigh, and discussed what their plans are for further education or employment, following their GCSEs in 2026. As a result of the responses received, 160 of these students will participate in a Lord Lawson Sixth Form Taster Day, where they will experience A level lessons in four subjects of their choice.

Our sixth form students actually study only three subjects, unless they select further maths as a fourth; however, the taster day will enable them to experience a greater range of subjects, to ensure they feel confident in making the decision that is right for them and their future academic or career pathways.

For students wishing to study at college or apply for an apprenticeship, we have representatives from New College Durham coming into Lord Lawson to deliver a carousel of three sessions designed to support this pathway. In the afternoon these students will participate in a virtual work experience, watch a documentary, and have the opportunity to visit a small careers fair in the main hall.

We hope students' will find this day informative and enjoyable. For this day, all students will be allowed to wear sixth form dress code, this is smart casual clothing. Our only exceptions are sportswear, i.e. football tops, shorts, lycra – leggings, crop tops or stringy vest tops.





Music Homework – How to Find the Task

- All music homework is set in a program call Focus on Sound (www.portal.focusonsound.com) However, the easiest way to reach the task is simply to log in to Classcharts and click on the link attached to your homework task.
- 2. Find our school in the drop down menu then click on the 'login' button



3. Sign in using your school email address. This is your username (the username that you use to login to the school computers) followed by @lordlawson.academy eg. 24asmith@lordlawson.academy.



4. Enter your password. This is the same password that you use to log in to the school network too.



At this point you will be logged in with the task on your screen and ready to work through it. When you finish the quiz at the **end of the task you MUST click on the 'end/save lesson' button** to save your work. If you don't do this then your score will be lost and you will have to take the quiz again.



Secondary School Admissions


This information is for any parents/carers who have primary school aged children who are looking to apply to a secondary school.
