Dear Parents and Carers

We held our annual Open Evening for Year 6 students and their parents and carers last night. Thank you so much to all our students who participated. Over 300 students volunteered to take part – presenting with me in the hall, performing, as tour guides, helping out in all our different departments and as part of the year base team. I shall be giving the Principal's Award (P5) to everyone who took part in the evening. It was good to see some of you there too, with children in Year 6 currently, looking to make the best choice for the future. Thank you also to you, as parents and carers, who made it possible for your children to be part of this wonderful event.

Your children may already have told you that we were exceptionally busy last night. In fact, we had over 500 visitors, and we had to put out extra chairs. Members of staff who have been here for 10 years told me that this is the first time we have needed to do this. Our popularity is testament to the improvements we have made here and the high quality of education we are able to offer all our students.

Some parents shared their concerns about the school being oversubscribed for next year. My message to them – and please pass this on if you are asked, or if you are wondering yourself – is that the best way to secure a place at Lord Lawson is to put this school as 1st choice on the admission form. We have not been oversubscribed with first choices in the past, so there is a very strong likelihood that a 1st choice for Lord Lawson will secure a place for your/their child.

We are continuing to monitor the proposed bus strike. Information is not completely clear, because drivers intending to strike are not required to inform their employers in advance, and some drivers may not have made up their minds yet. However, the information we have from Nexus and Go No East is that they will prioritise the scholars' bus services, and that they expect them to run as usual. Public bus services – such as the number 21 – are more uncertain, and we do not have definite information about them. Please see Mr Rayner's message later in this bulletin.

I am looking forward to meeting parents and carers of students in Year 7 at our 'Meet the Tutors Evening' on Thursday 5 October. This evening begins in the main hall at 3:30pm with some messages and information, before breaking into tutor groups.

I know that many of you are eagerly waiting the opportunity to buy your tickets for our production of *Shrek the Musical, Junior*, which takes place on the last week of this half term. Tickets are on sale from our school reception from Monday 2 October. It has been great to see the show coming into shape during the twice-weekly rehearsals. If you have not seen a Lord Lawson show before, I urge you to come: the standard is amazing, and the performances are wonderful!

Bus Strikes

We are aware of the industrial action which is taking place from Saturday 30 September to Friday 6 October inclusive.

We have spoken to Nexus and Go North East who have confirmed that all of the scholars' services will be running. However, public services will be significantly impacted. Therefore, we ask parents and carers of students who are potentially affected to make alternative transport arrangements where possible if their child uses public transport, as there will be no skeleton services in operation.

For holders of Go North East Season tickets (weekly, monthly, annual passes) please note these will be accepted on Tyne and Wear Metro services during the strike periods; please show staff on the Metro your pass to travel.

If your child usually travels to school by car, then please allow additional time for your journey as the roads will be busier than normal.

Academy staff are aware of the situation and will make appropriate allowances for any students who may arrive slightly later than normal as a result of the strikes.
