Dear Parents and Carers

I write to you on a wet and windy Friday. Outside, the fringes of Storm Babet buffet our trees and our buildings. Inside, our students and staff are coping well with staying indoors at break and lunchtime – it's not what anyone wants, but it's much better than being exposed to the elements of wind and water. My sister teaches in a school in northeast Scotland, where today they face a rare red alert for the weather.

As a school leader, I always take a keen interest in the weather forecast, because I know the profound effect changes in our weather can have on our feelings of wellbeing. We enjoy a temperate climate here in Britain – even in the North East! – and that probably makes us even more aware of, and more susceptible to, small changes in temperature and conditions. Many of us say we prefer it to be warmer, but too hot is upsetting; too cold is miserable; and so on. Resilience to changes in the weather and the climate seems to be hard for us to achieve, as individuals and as a nation.

Changes in our 'emotional temperature' also affect us, although perhaps not so predictably. Yesterday I attended the Schools North East Conference at St James's Park where, with school leaders from across our region, I was fascinated to hear Professor Steve Peters speak about emotional resilience. Many of you will know of Steve Peters from his work with high-performing sports teams. His book, *The Chimp Paradox*, explains how the different parts of our minds work together (or, occasionally, work against each other) to condition and control our responses to different situations. Steve Peters has messages for us all – as parents, children and teachers – about how we regulate ourselves and how we understand one another. It will take me some time to process his insights and apply them to our own context.

Schools North East is the largest group of school leaders anywhere in the country. At our conference yesterday, we also heard from the Secretary of State for Education, Gillian Keegan. She referenced her own school experience in Knowsley – she was characteristically disparaging about the schools there, although she also acknowledged some inspiring teaching, particularly in technical subjects – and her unusual route into parliament, via a degree apprenticeship in engineering and a career in business. Although the Education Secretary had relatively little to offer us in the way of vision or ideas (and nothing in the way of additional funding for schools or high needs) it was interesting to hear from another perspective about the difference that can be made when parents and teachers work together for the good of students.

At the same time as the Education Secretary was talking to school leaders in our region, the Department for Education published its School Performance Tables. These showed that Lord Lawson achieved a Progress 8 figure that is broadly in line with the national average. No-one wants to be merely 'average', of course, and this is not our overall ambition, so it is good to contextualise this figure. Also in this 'average' category in Gateshead are St Thomas More Catholic School, Thorp Academy and Whickham School. The North East, as a region, was at the bottom of the national league. Other schools locally – including all the schools that are geographically closest to Lord Lawson in Gateshead, Sunderland and County Durham districts – performed less well than we did and are below average. We regard these figures as validation of the work that we have done so far to improve the educational opportunities for your children, and a solid foundation for the further improvement work that we are doing together right now.

I am acutely aware of the difficulties that have been imposed on so many families by the continued industrial action on public service buses. Many of you, and your children, will have been badly affected by the strike. Thank you for everything you have done to make sure that your children can get to school and benefit from the education and extra-curricular opportunities we offer.

There is a possibility that industrial action will extend beyond the current period. Last week, I appealed to parents who were bringing their children to school by car and who had additional places in their vehicle to consider offering a place to a child who was struggling to get to school. I would now like to add a little more detail to my appeal.

First, it is important to stress that this would be an arrangement between parents/carers. The parents and carers of any child would of course have to give their permission and consent for their child to travel in the car of another parent. No child should accept a lift from someone they don't know, a safeguarding message that we reinforce to our students regularly.

Secondly, I regret that it is not possible for the school to arrange car-sharing. We do not have the resources to match families together, and we do not have the information about who drives and how many spaces they might have. We don't know, for example, about other siblings who are being taken to primary school.

We are grateful to parents and carers who have already made arrangements with other families. Such practical support means a great deal at such a difficult time. Dame Rachel de Souza, the Children's Commissioner, also spoke at yesterday's conference. Her message was about the importance of school attendance for the educational and social development of children.

Finally, we have reached the week of our performances of *Shrek the Musical*. Having seen some of the rehearsals and assembly previews, I know that we have a wonderfully entertaining show here, full of diverse characters and memorable tunes. A few tickets still remain for performances. I hope to see many of you and your children there next week!

Academy Production - Shrek The Musical, Jr: Tuesday 24 to Friday 27 October 2023

After 9 months of rehearsal we have reached show week for our 2023 Academy Production, Shrek The Musical Junior.

Our final Sunday rehearsal is this Sunday 22 October, 10am to 4pm. Students must attend with a packed lunch, plenty of refreshments, warm layers of clothing and all of the costume and make up items (including make up removal) they require for their performance. Students will be wearing face paint and full costume during this rehearsal.

All performers must bring their all black basic costume: plain black short sleeved round neck t- shirt, plain black trousers (no logos) and lace up shoes. Lace up shoes are essential. Cast members will not be allowed on the stage with slip on shoes due to health and safety concerns.

It would be helpful if students could write their names clearly in their black clothing and come to the rehearsal wearing these items.

All cast members **must** attend this final technical dress rehearsal to be able to perform during show week.

On Monday 23 October all cast members will be off timetable for the whole school day to perform a dress rehearsal to our feeder primary school guests. Students must come into the academy with all of the items that they had for the Sunday rehearsal.

There is no rafter school rehearsal on Monday evening; students will leave the academy at 3.20pm as normal. We encourage all performers to have a restful evening to prepare for the big week ahead.

Tuesday 24 October is opening night and the first of four evening performances across the week, all of which start at 7pm. Students are expected to return to the academy for registration at 5.30pm on each performance evening. Main cast members may be required earlier to prepare their full stage costume and make up.

We except the performance to end at approximately 9pm. Parents and carers should aim to collect performers between 9.10 and 9.20pm latest.

Please ensure that performers have signed out of their dressing room upon collection to avoid the Performing Arts team having to confirm the whereabout of students after the end of the event.

All of our cast have worked extremely hard to create a magical, fun and heart-warming show. Thank you to all who have supported the project throughout the rehearsal process and we hope you enjoy the final performances next week.
