Week commencing Monday 18 December 2023 – Week 1

Dear Parents and Carers

As we start the last week of this long term, I want to look both back and forward, and also give some notices for the present time – not quite the ghosts of Christmases past, present and yet to come, but you get the idea.

First, I will look ahead now to **arrangements for the end of term** and the beginning of next term. **This next week is a full school week**. Our **attendance incentives** (watching a film with other members of the year group) run this coming week, **Monday to Thursday**.

On **Friday**, the last day of term, we have a **non-uniform day**, and we encourage students to **wear a Christmas jumper** to help the festive atmosphere. After normal lessons for periods 1 and 2, students will have a programme of engaging and fun activities, with Christmas dinner available in the cafeteria. We finish at the usual time of **3:20pm on Friday 22 December**.

We are supporting **Gateshead Food Bank in Birtley** again this year, helping with the hugely valuable work they do to support families all year round. Please encourage your child to bring £1 donation for the Food Bank with them on the last day of term.

Our next term begins on Monday 8 January 2024 at the usual time. Students need to be on site by 8:45am in full school uniform. Please note that there is no staff training day in January — we start back with a full school day for all students on Monday 8 January with the normal timetable for Week 2.

Looking back over the term: with your encouragement, and recognising the hard work of students and staff, we have significantly **improved students' punctuality to lessons** this term, resulting in a considerable gain in learning time. Almost all students are getting to lessons comfortably within the 4-minute target time we set ourselves at the start of the year. Lesson routines at the beginning and end of lessons are much smarter, which again maximises learning time.

We can do little to make our **corridors** wider or less busy, but we have worked to make them a more pleasant environment for everyone. Students know to walk on the left, and to avoid physical contact. This 'no unnecessary physical contact' instruction is a straightforward rule: it was introduced in September and reinforced recently; students understand it well by now.

We launched a programme of over 50 weekly **extra-curricular activities** at the start of the year. It has been wonderful to see so many students participating. Apart from a few snowy days, we have also continued to allow access to the tennis court and astro turf to students at lunchtimes. The Hub is well used by students with additional needs. Service in the school cafeteria has improved further, and students are complimentary about the quality of the food they eat there. Opportunities for student leadership have increased.

Among the departments that have made particularly significant contributions to extra-curricular activities, I would like to single out PE and Performing Arts. The range of excellence and inclusion in PE is unparalleled, in my experience, resulting in very many successes and trophies this term. Our Performing Arts Department has put on not one but *two* sell-out shows this year (*Shrek* and, last week, *A Christmas Shrektacular* pantomime), and some performers will also entertain other members of the school on the last day.

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We have continued our focus on staff development, so that we can offer the very best education to your children. We welcomed six new teachers to the staff, and they are progressing very well. Among staff successes, 14 members of staff have completed National Professional Qualifications at different levels, and almost half the teaching staff are involved in Ambition Institute's Transforming Teaching Programme. Miss Ford graduated as a Teacher Education Fellow with Ambition Institute. Both Deputy Principals, Mr Dicocco and Mr Cooper, should be congratulated on being awarded the National Professional Qualification for Headship (NPQH) – although we hope they will be happy to remain here as deputies for a little longer! And, on a personal note, I have completed my doctorate in education with Durham University: I shall have the degree of Doctor of Philosophy conferred on me in a ceremony at Durham Cathedral on 4 January 2024.

Sadly, we see four colleagues leave us at the end of this term. Mr Calvin Rodger has taught Geography at the school for 19 years, and he has made a valued contribution as Head of Geography and, more recently, Subject Leader for Humanities. Mr Glenn Thompson has been with us for 13 years, as Teacher of PE, Subject Leader and, most recently, Year Leader. Miss Sophie Brown leaves the PE Department after two years with us; she has also been Coordinator for the Gateshead School Sports Partnership. Miss Maddison Thompson has worked as our Social Emotional and Mental Health Mentor for three years, supporting some of our most vulnerable students. On your behalf, I want to thank all these colleagues for their excellent work among us, supporting your children, and we wish them all the very best for their future roles. We have made appropriate arrangements and appointments to replace their teaching, leadership and support roles, and I will introduce new colleagues to you in January.

There will be no parents' and carers' bulletin next Friday, as we are involved in our end of term arrangements, and I shall be co-presenting the Christmas Celebration for students. News for the start of next year is included in this bulletin. I shall therefore take this opportunity to thank you all for your support this term, and to wish you and your families a joyful and peaceful Christmas, and a very Happy New Year.


