		The NHS Virtual Allied Healthcare Work Experience offers a unique opportunity for aspiring healthcare professionals. Students will hear from a nurse, Sarah Trevannah, who will provide guidance to help these future professionals embark on their dream healthcare careers. Following Sarah's talk, students will gain insights into the healthcare industry in the LIVE virtual work experience, delving into diverse roles within allied healthcare and patient care by following the journeys of two patients from incident through to treatment.
		The NHS Allied Healthcare Work Experience is a successful programme for aspiring healthcare professionals, having had 12,000 students participating in its programme last academic year, many of whom have gone on to study: Nursing, Midwifery, Paramedicine, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Dietetics, Radiography, Prosthetics and Orthotics, Speech and Language Therapy, and Pharmacy.
		Every complete session comes with a Work Experience Certificate, and for those who complete the full 6-month programme, there's a Highly Commended Reference – a golden ticket for their apprenticeship and UCAS applications.
		Students can register at any time throughout the 6-month programme using the link below. We recommend booking early to gain as much out of this programme as possible.

THE MYPATH GUIDE TO Apprenticeships



WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

An apprenticeship is a type of work-based training program where you can learn a specific trade or skill directly from experienced professionals in a real workplace setting whilst getting paid.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

During an apprenticeship, you typically split your time between on-thejob training and classroom-based learning. This combination allows you to apply what you learn in a real work environment while also gaining the theoretical knowledge that supports your practical skills. The goal is to provide you with a well-rounded education and prepare you for a career in a specific field whilst also earning money!





LEVELS

This is commonly the starting point for people entering apprenticeships. The level 2 apprenticeships are the equivalent to 5 CCSEs.

These levels are usually for people with more managerial or technical roles.

Level 4 is equivalent to a foundation degree and level 5 is equivalent to a higher national diploma.

On a level 3 apprenticeship, an apprentice will develop their knowledge further. This is equivalent to two A Levels.

These are the highest levels of apprenticeships in the UK. Level 6 is the equivalent to a bachelor's degree and Level 7 is the equivalent to a masters degree.

MYTHBUSTING

People often think of apprenticeships being all about practical jobs. Did you know you can do an apprenticeship to become a Dentist, Accountant or a Solicitor amongst lots of other jobs?
