The National Citizen Service (NCS) is a personal and social development programme for 15 to 17 year-olds. Established in 2011, NCS aims to build a more cohesive, mobile, and engaged society. By bringing young people together from different backgrounds for a unique, shared experience, it helps build confidence and unlock potential.

The NCS 'away from' experiences are **five-day**, **four-night residential trips** where young people will be able to try new activities and learn new skills. There are three experience themes available to choose from:

Live It: survival and confidence skills with a bit of adrenaline thrown in! Boss It: gain business skills and develop your creative talent. Change It: make a change with social action, exploring important issues in society.

NCS is amazing value for money (Government supported) – the whole experience costs students only $\pounds 95$ and in some cases is completely Free! This includes activities, transport, meals, and accommodation. There are also bursaries available making NCS accessible to all.
