Dear Parents and Carers

I wonder if you were watching/listening to the Budget on Wednesday, wondering what the Chancellor's plans held for you and for your concerns? I caught up with the headlines for education as soon as I could – and the news is that... there is no news. Not for us, at any rate. 20 new free schools are to be created, offering much-needed **alternative provision** in areas across the country. Two are to be in the northeast, but these are in Redcar and Stockton, so they are not accessible to our students. Alternative provision is a real issue: our curriculum is appropriate for the large majority of our students, but not for all, and the other options are very limited. Last week we hosted a working party meeting for headteachers, college leaders and others within Gateshead who are looking to put together a package of vocational learning alongside teaching in English and mathematics.

Schools received their **funding statements** this week, telling us how much income we will have next year. I have seen it reported that education funding is 'at a record high.' Last time I went shopping, I saw that prices were at a record high too and had increased at a faster rate than anyone's income! Our funding has not kept pace with rising costs and wage increases and, as a result, the school is less well funded than at the same point last year. We are fortunate that the finances of Lord Lawson of Beamish Academy are stable and well managed, but we still have to make tough decisions and focus our funds solely on improving the quality of learning that we offer.

On a more positive note, 1 March was **National Offer Day**, when children in Year 6 and their families found out at which secondary school they have been allocated a place for September 2024. We were **oversubscribed this year**, and we have been able to offer a few more places, but we have not been able to satisfy every request for a place. Including first, second and third choices, 399 sets of parents/carers expressed a preference for Lord Lawson. Children with an Educational Health Care Plan and children who are in the care of the local authority receive priority, under the school's oversubscription criteria. This is in line with our vision to make sure we offer a great education to those who need it most. Overall, **we have offered 245 places** for Year 7 in September. I am sorry that we have not been able to meet the aspirations of everyone who wants to come to Lord Lawson. I have already written to parents and carers of the 245 students who have places, and we look forward to welcoming them into our community for transition days and our summer schools.

Looking ahead even further, we have our **Open Evening for children currently in Year 5** and their parents/carers on **Thursday 21 March, starting at 4:30pm**. This is a lovely opportunity for younger children and their families to find out more about our school. Please do **spread the word** to your friends and neighbours. In the most recent survey of parents and carers, a large majority said they would recommend this school to other parents, and we hope that you will feel able to recommend your school warmly to those whom you know with children at primary school.

Responding to feedback from parents and carers, Mr Cave is looking to organise an event soon for **parents and carers of students in Year 11**, to help you understand great ways in which you can **support your child as they prepare for their GCSE and vocational examinations**. A number of teachers have already volunteered to run workshops as part of this evening, and we look forward to inviting you to this event. More details will be available soon.
