

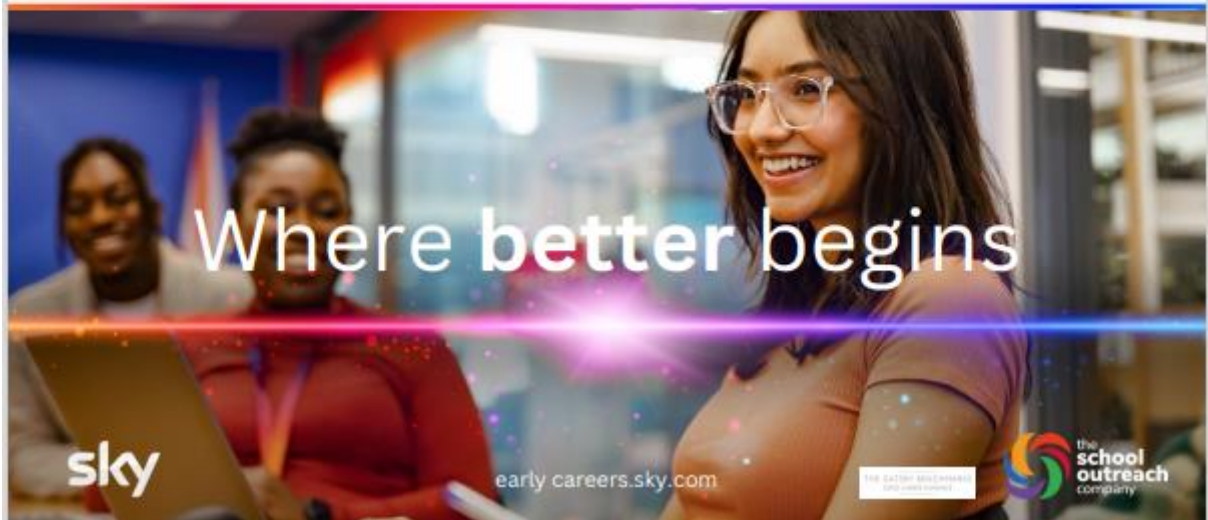

Reconstructing the Social Contract' - 'Youth Advocate' Opportunity - Registration of Interest Form

The Equality Trust works to improve the quality of life in the UK by reducing economic and social inequality. If we want to build a better society, it is essential we take action.

The Equality Trust is working with others to build a social movement for change. We analyse and disseminate the latest research, promote robust evidence-based arguments and support a dynamic network of campaign groups across the country.

Young people today face a multitude of challenges from insecure work, a lack of affordable housing, stagnant pay, high levels of debt, and the societal pressures of growing up in the digital age.

Previous generations could rely on work paying enough to not only survive but to thrive and live a fulfilling life. The security of a comprehensive welfare state meant that if you fell on hard times you would not be left destitute. This understanding between citizen and state is often referred to as the 'social contract.'

For young people today this agreement has disintegrated and through this project we are looking to explore the challenges young people face today as well as their hopes for the future and a possible reimagining of what a social contract fit for the 21st century would look like.

If you are **aged 16-25** and **interested in affecting social change** then we want to hear from you!

We are looking to sign-up 'Youth Advocates' to be involved in this project. Advocates will share their own experiences and will also learn how to gather stories through engaging with their peers. Through 'Community Reporting' techniques, 'Youth Advocates' will uncover the stories behind the statistics, offering insights into how young people perceive society, work, the role of government, corporations, and the future. As a Youth Advocate you will become a fully trained 'Community Reporter' and will learn how to ethically gather people's authentic stories about their lived experience. At the end of the training there will be an opportunity to reflect, share and celebrate the stories you have gathered at our final presentation ceremony.

Becoming a Youth Advocate involves taking part in 6 online training sessions (May - July) on Zoom from 6pm – 8:30pm. You need to be available for all sessions:

Session 1 - Wednesday 15 May

Session 2 - Wednesday 22 May

Session 3 - Wednesday 29 May

Session 4 - Wednesday 5 June

Break - There will be a two week break to allow you to put what you have learnt into practice and gather stories in your community.

Session 5 - Wednesday 26 June

Session 6 - Wednesday 3 July

Each Youth Advocate will receive £200 upon full completion of the training and will also receive a fee for each story gathered during the project.
