
Chartwells

Important Message About the Scholars Bus Services

Due to a noticeable increase in concerns raised by the drivers of Gateshead schools scholars' buses, Go North East are now monitoring the cameras of every Gateshead scholar service bus on a daily basis.

The issues reported by drivers include students littering the bus, throwing items at other students, failing to follow the instructions of the drivers which can be a health and safety concern, fighting on the buses, and generally being unpleasant to others.

On each bus service, there are cameras that cover all areas of the bus. This CCTV will be provided to schools to review if issues are identified.

Should any Lord Lawson students be observed acting inappropriately on any of our scholars' buses, sanctions will be issued within school. Incidents may also be reported to Northumbria Police and the privilege of using the scholars' service may be removed from a student.

Our students have been advised of this information in tutor time this week. Should any student have a concern in relation to their journey on a scholars bus, they should speak to their year team.

Exam Stress Dropin Sessions

Gateshead Children and Young People's Primary Care Mental Health Service team offer children, young people and their parents/carers support to manage low mood, anxiety and emotional regulation difficulties.

The team have planned regular drop-in sessions for parents and carers on specific mental health presentations. Initial feedback from parents has been positive for example, "Very helpful, thank you for the resources. I really appreciate your support".

A common issue around this time of year is the exam stresses many children experience. To support our Gateshead community the team have arranged a number of sessions for this particular issue.
