Dear Parents and Carers
On Tuesday, our Year 11 students 'left' the academy. They sat their science examination, then they had some time signing shirts, talking to friends and taking pictures, and they had a short leavers' assembly with some reminders of their time at Lord Lawson. They then left school early with their copies of the Yearbook and their memories of an important rite of passage.

I have put the word 'left' in inverted commas, for several reasons. Many of the same students were back in the following days to sit some of their last examinations. We hope to see as many of them as possible at their prom on 28 June, and when they pick up their GCSE and vocational results on Thursday 22 August. And,
importantly, we hope to see as many of them as possible next year in our sixth form. Whether they are moving on or staying with us, they will always be our Lord Lawson students, and we hope to see them again in the future.

I feel a particular bond with this group of students. I arrived at Lord Lawson just four school weeks before they did, in June 2019. They have therefore been the first year group that I have seen all the way from arrival to examination results. Together, we faced COVID, lockdowns and starting school again, coming to terms with all the different rules and regulations of the pandemic and its aftermath. Together we have transformed this school. Together, as you might expect me to say, we have grown, learnt and succeeded! I have valued the characters and contributions of these students, I am proud of the young people they have become, and I hope their futures are truly wonderful.

I have some changes to announce in our Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Department. Today Mrs Angela Ganning leaves us for promotion at another school. Mrs Ganning has worked in our Learning Support Room, helping students overcome difficulties with their learning, their concentration, their attitudes and their behaviour. I want to thank Mrs Ganning for everything she has done for our children, and we wish her well in the future.

I can also announce the appointment of our two Assistant SEND Coordinators. These are Mrs Jill Whittle and Miss Rebecca Mouat. Both Miss Mouat and Mrs Whittle have already been working for us as higher level teaching assistants; they now take up responsibilities in working with Mrs Potter to coordinate and direct the work of our SEND team to support many of our students. We look forward to their work in these new positions.

Finally, we were visited this morning by the Joint Council for Qualifications Examinations Inspector. He visits examination centres every year, quality assuring the conduct and supervision of examinations. The inspector declared Lord Lawson to be a 'Centre of Excellence' for examinations, and he highly commended our students, invigilators and examinations officers on the way that examinations are conducted. Having declared the school to be excellent in this respect, he told us, 'you could not do any more than you do to support your students in their examinations.' On your behalf, I would like to thank Mrs Cooksey and Mrs Ridley, our Examination Officers, our team of invigilators, and our pastoral and subject staff, for the support they give your children at this important time.

## New Intake Evening

On Monday 1 and Tuesday 2 July all year 6 students will participate in two days of activities, which will provide your child with an authentic taste of life at Lord Lawson, in preparation for their start with us in September.

## Attendance Incentive

On Monday 13 May, we launched to students our attendance incentive for the end of the summer term. All students who meet the entry requirements will enjoy a 'Fun Day' during the last week of term, the day and date of which will be confirmed later, but I can confirm it will not be the last Friday of the summer term i.e. 19 July 2024.

Student attendance will be reviewed for an 8-week period, from Monday 13 May 2024 to Friday 12 July 2024.

The criteria for students to qualify for this incentive and reward is based on a 3-tier system, details of which can be found below.

- Tier 1 : achieve $100 \%$ attendance and receive no C Codes
- Tier 2 : achieve over $96 \%$ attendance and receive no more than 8 negative points
- Tier 3 : Demonstrate a significant improvement in attendance and behaviour (a member of the school Senior Leadership Team (SLT) will take this decision)

Spot prizes will be issued throughout the 8 -week incentive. Any student who does not meet the qualifying criteria will attend lessons on the day as normal.

Key points for students to remember are:

- Their attendance for the incentive is measured between 13 May and 12 July
- Student behaviour points are measured between 13 May and 12 July

This provides students who may have accumulated negative behaviour points or have had low attendance before 13 May, to have a 'fresh start' and begin the incentive review period from a ' 0 ' negative start.

- Students achieving Tier 1 - will have automatic entry to the 'fun day'
- Students achieving Tier 2 or Tier 3 - their entry will be dependent on spaces available
- Students achieving Tier 3 - their entry is also based on the decision of a member of SLT

We have also given our students the opportunity to provide us with suggestions and ideas for some of the activities they may wish to be included on their day, such as:

- Inflatables
- Ice Cream Van
- BBQ
- Sporting activities
- Burger van
- DJ
- Sweet stall
- Silent Disco

Any suggestions or ideas students have should be passed to their tutor representatives, tutor, or any member of their year team.

Please discuss these incentives and the qualifying criteria with your child and help them to be part of what will be a fantastic and 'fun' day!
